Planned Giving is the process of enhancing the economic and tax benefits of making gifts to charity.

It is important that donors take the time to understand the multiple options that are available to them.

WILLS AND BEQUESTS

Wills and bequests are easy to understand and implement. The donor reserves the right to change bequests by modifying their last will and testament. With a will or bequest, the donor retains all rights to assets during life.

LIFE INSURANCE (LI)

Life insurance allows the donor to substantially increase the amount of money that they can leave to charity. New and/or existing policies can be utilized. If the insurance policy is given to charity during life, the donor can benefit from an income tax deduction. The donor can benefit from an estate tax deduction if a charity is named the beneficiary but the donor owns policy during life.

GIFTS OF RETIREMENT PLAN ASSETS (GRPA)

With gifts of retirement plan assets, charity is made the beneficiary of some or all of retirement plan assets. This giving option eliminates both income and estate taxes on heavily taxed assets.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED ASSETS (GAA)

Donors benefit from a full tax deduction, and avoidance of capital gains tax for assets gifted. Giving gifts of appreciated assets is more cost effective than gifts of cash or by check. Donors can include investments, real estate, business interests, etc. in gifts of appreciated assets.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUSTS (CRT)

For charitable remainder trusts, an income interest goes to the individual for a period of time and then the remainder interest goes to charity when the income interest ends. Donors can benefit from a partial income tax deduction based on the valuation of the gift. Estate taxes on assets in CRT are eliminated at death. Capital gain tax on sale of asset are avoided in the CRT.

CHARITABLE LEAD TRUSTS (CLT)

In a charitable lead trust, an income interest goes to the charity for a period of time. The remainder interest goes to the donor(s) when the income interest ends. The donor can benefit from:

- A partial income tax deduction for income directed to charity during life
- A partial estate tax deduction for income directed to charity after death
- The possibility to reduce estate tax on assets to zero
- Deferred inheritance for amounts left after the charity's income interest ends

The Carson Scholars Program recognizes and rewards students in grades 4-11 who excel academically and are dedicated to volunteering in their communities. Students are nominated by their schools and honored at one of 9 regional award ceremonies. New scholars receive a \$1,000 scholarship towards college and previous winners are eligible to reapply for Carson Scholar Recognition annually provided that they maintain their academic status and high level of volunteerism. The program is designed to identify and encourage future leaders, and is active in all 50 states.

The Ben Carson Reading Project was created to combat illiteracy and promote leisure reading as a key to unlocking a child's full learning potential. Reading rooms are vibrant spaces located within a school - packed full of the most popular and exciting books. Rooms are typically themed and promote an encouraging attitude towards learning.
