The Carson Scholars Fund was founded in 1994 by now retired world-renowned pediatric neurosurgeon Dr. Ben Carson and his wife, Candy. The goal of the Carson Scholars Fund goes beyond a simple monetary scholarship program.

The Carson Scholars program recognizes and rewards academic excellence in young students (grades 4-11) who also have strong humanitarian

qualities. Students are nominated by their school and are recognized at an annual regional awards banquet. New scholars receive a \$1,000 scholarship towards college, medal and certificate, and their school receives a trophy. Each year, scholars may reapply for Carson Scholar recognition and renew their status as Carson Scholars provided that they maintain their academic status and high level of volunteerism.

The Carson Scholars Program is more than just a scholarship program.

It starts young, encouraging a college-bound culture in schools across the country. Scholars are given an incentive to achieve and are exposed to inspirational adult leaders. More importantly, Carson Scholars are role models in their schools and communities. Collectively, they are



shaping a better future for themselves, their schools and their communities.
