

A MESSAGE FROM DR. & MRS. CARSON

25 years! Where has the time gone? Our original scholars are now the leaders we hoped they would become; they are doctors, entrepreneurs, professors, television producers, educators and so much more. Our current scholars and recent alumni are preparing for careers that did not exist 25 years ago.

When we reach milestones in our lives we tend to reflect on where we came from, where we are and where we are going. This year the Carson Scholars Fund achieved two major milestones: we celebrated our 25th anniversary of awarding scholarships and presented our 10,000th scholarship to an amazing young man in Palm Beach, Florida.

Before we redirect our thoughts to these questions, we first want to thank you! Without our donors, volunteers, educators and community leaders, we would not be writing this letter. Your support and tremendous generosity encourage us every day to continue working to empower our country's youth.

Where we came from: In the 1990's, reports showed the educational system in the United States was not keeping up with the rest of the world, especially in math and science. While our colleges and universities are some of the finest in the world, many of our country's students did not have the educational foundation necessary to succeed in higher education. These statistics were alarming. Around the same time, we had the opportunity to visit many schools. While we understood schools were proud of and celebrated athletic and extracurricular accomplishments, we were disappointed not to find the same level of celebration being accorded to students who were excelling academically and altruistically. We set out to change that!

Five years later, we added the Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Project. Literacy is the foundation in ensuring success in life. We recognized that when a child finds reading fun they are more likely to make the choice to read. Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Rooms are engaging spaces that encourage students to select topics and genres that appeal to them as individual readers.

Where we are: 2021 marks the 25th anniversary of the first Carson Scholars awards ceremony and we have now granted 10,020 scholarships to extraordinary young people across the country. We were challenged to change the format of our awards ceremony to a

virtual ceremony again this year due to the unpredictable nature of COVID-19 and its variants. While this was a difficult decision, as meeting and celebrating our amazing scholars is the highlight of our year, we recognize that health and safety are paramount.

Our reading rooms have grown exponentially. We currently have 235 established reading rooms across the country granting access to more than 108,000 students to experience our reading rooms. Over \$3 million has been invested in the program to provide more than 117,500 high-interest books and thousands of hours of reading.

Where we are going: The need for compassionate leadership has never been more self-evident than it has been these past couple of years. A pandemic of unprecedented proportions has created shifts in the world that few predicted. Our scholars are facing futures where they will be tasked with combining human intelligence with digital intelligence. Empathy, creativity and compassion will be critical skills alongside technical knowledge.

While it is uncertain what the future holds, we know we will need to adapt and prepare for the changes that advanced technology will bring to the world. To create sustainable growth in all fields, humans will need to manage systems, machines and human interaction. The CSF will continue to work to find ways to empower this country's youth by providing encouragement, support and resources needed to help them advance society, allowing future generations the opportunity to prosper.

We look forward to continuing to open reading rooms, with the hope of opening our 250th room in the near future. Even more so, literacy will continue to be fundamental with regards to the opportunity for success. If machines can replace humans for everyday tasks, it will be critical that our society has citizens who have the capacity to problem solve.

Pablo Picasso once said, "The meaning of life is to find your gift. The purpose of life is to give it away." Each of you are living out these words and we are incredibly grateful! We know you are inspiring our scholars to do the same. Virtual hugs!

ABOUT THE CARSON SCHOLARS FUND

The CSF's mission is two-fold. Our scholarship program exists to recognize and reward students who excel academically and serve their communities with compassion. The purpose of our reading room program is to cultivate an inviting environment where reading is desirable, fun and enjoyable for students.

CARSON SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Carson Scholars Program partners with educators to identify and reward students who work hard in school and make the world a better place through acts of kindness and service to others. During the scholarship cycle, educators may nominate students enrolled in grades 4-11, who possess at least a 3.75 GPA and participate in service activities. Carson Scholars are often leaders and role models in their schools and communities.

The scholarship program encourages a college-going mindset and awards students a \$1,000 scholarship to be invested towards their college education, along with a recognition package that provides a tangible reward for their achievements. Carson Scholars also have the opportunity to attend a banquet each year where they are honored in front of their families, peers and educators.



THE BEN CARSON/THINK BIG READING PROJECT

The Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Project seeks to combat illiteracy and promote leisure reading as a key to unlocking a child's full potential. Reading plays a crucial role in children's development by fostering learning, imagination, compassion and so much more.


The Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Project launched in 2000 and over the last 20 years, has provided funding and support to create over 230 literacy-enriched environments across the country.

Each room is decorated and furnished to provide an inviting atmosphere where students feel comfortable to explore literature and self-select reading materials based solely on their interests. 



ASSOCIATE LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

In September 2020, a dynamic group of professionals joined together to form the first ever CSF Associate Leadership Council (ALC). The group was assembled based on recommendations by board members, alumni scholars, and friends and associates of the CSF. After establishing leadership positions, the group went right to work with the focus on fundraising alumni engagement. Several scholarships have been funded to date, a quarterly newsletter has been established with the hopes of providing alumni with a forum to share opinions, develop professional networking opportunities and to provide resources for current and future scholars. A resume hub was one of the first concepts to take hold and is available to scholars and alumni to provide guidance as scholars build their resumes and seek employment.


