"My name is Antar Tichavakunda and I was a four-time Carson Scholar. The funding from this scholarship made my higher education journey much more manageable and I am very grateful for the generous support from the foundation.

I was born and raised in Washington, DC and am a product of DC Public Schools. I attended Brown University where I majored in Education Studies/Policy. There, I joined the first Black Greek Letter Organization, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. After graduating, I worked as a teacher in DC Public Schools for two years. During that time, I also earned a Master's in Education from George Mason University. While working in DC as a teacher, I became passionate about research and the power of narratives on impacting educational policy. I then decided to try my chances at a PhD.

I earned a PhD in Urban Education Policy from the University of Southern California where I earned the School of Education's Dissertation of the Year award. I now work as a tenure-track assistant professor of education at the University of Cincinnati. Broadly, I research the sociology of race and higher education and study Black student life at predominantly white institutions of higher education. I have published in journals such as the Review of Higher Education, Urban Education, Race, Ethnicity and Education, and Educational Policy. My first book, <u>Black Campus Life: The Worlds Black Students Make at a Historically White Institution</u>, will be published in the coming months with SUNY Press."

2022 New and Recognized Scholars Awarded

This May, the CSF is hosting seven movie premieres across the country to celebrate its 2022 new and recognized scholars.

CSF judges were amazed by the level of talent, scholarship and commitment to service this group of applicants brought to the table. In a time of great adversity, these scholars are transforming education and finding new ways to help others.

Across the nation, 547 new students were named 2022 Carson Scholars. Each scholar receives a \$1,000 college scholarship, a personalized medal, certificate of accomplishment and an invitation to an exclusive movie premiere of "Carson Scholars: Heroes Among Us." This CSF original movie features our very own 2022 scholars! This brings our total of scholarships awarded to over 10,500 representing scholars in all 50 states and Washington, DC.

In addition to this outstanding group, 803 students earned the prestigious status of being named a 2022 Recognized Scholar. This recognition affirms each scholar's commitment to reaching high academic standards and continuing their community service initiatives. Over 4,000 scholars have been recognized by the CSF multiple times.

After graduating from high school, our scholars become esteemed alumni. There are currently over 6,500 alumni, over 6,000 alumni who have used at least part of their scholarship and over \$8 million paid out on scholars' behalf to over 800 colleges and universities. Our alumni are represented as this country's leaders in their fields. These leaders continue to develop future generations, lead in their fields and impact local, national and global communities.
