ABOUT THE CARSON SCHOLARS FUND

Established in 1994 by co-founders Dr. Ben Carson and his wife, Candy, the Carson Scholars Fund was started to reinforce the importance of academic excellence and civic responsibility in the minds of young students, through scholarship and recognition. Six years later a companion program, the Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Project, was launched to combat illiteracy and nurture a love of reading.



THE CARSON SCHOLARS PROGRAM

With the belief that all children have the potential to excel, the Carson Scholars Program works in partnership with educators to identify and reward students who strive to achieve academic success and serve their communities. This prestigious award includes a \$1,000 college scholarship and national recognition. The award may be attained as early as fourth grade providing an opportunity for a student to become a role model for their peers. Each year a scholar may reaffirm their commitment to these principles with the opportunity to graduate high school as a Recognized Carson Scholar.





THE BEN CARSON/THINK BIG READING PROJECT

The Ben Carson/Think Big Reading Project serves communities by funding reading rooms in schools. Findings have shown that reading proficiency has a direct correlation with future success in life. When a child enjoys an activity they are more likely to continue it. Reading for pleasure leads to feelings of competence and promotes growth in the overall development of a child.

The 2023 Carson Scholars logged over 138,000 hours serving their communities.









Phyllis and Louis Friedmans' unwavering generosity and support of the Carson Scholars Fund has spanned over three decades. Both have provided leadership as board members and for a year Phyllis served as the CSF's executive director.

Early in Phyllis' career, she was an educator. As a teacher, she had a student who would stay after school to read in her classroom. When Phyllis inquired why she always stayed after school, she learned her home life was less than desirable and the child found reading as a way to escape and feel safe. Around the same time, Phyllis read Dr. Carson's story, *Gifted Hands*. She was so inspired by both her student's and Dr. Carson's stories, that she reached out to Dr. Carson.

The Friedmans' commitment to education and community has been resolute. As successful attorneys and business owners in the Baltimore area, they have used their influence and generosity to enrich the lives of so many. Through endowments and annual funding the Friedmans have facilitated, the CSF has awarded 163 scholarships to deserving students.

In addition, the Friedmans were instrumental in the development and growth of the Ben Carson Reading Project, our second mission, which began in 2000. As well as funding the first room built at Hall's Cross Roads Elementary School in Aberdeen, Maryland, the Friedmans took a personal role and collaborated with the school's principal to design and ensure the success of the reading room. The Friedmans continue to strengthen the project through maintenance, funding rooms and influencing others with regards to the impact of the project. Their commitment to the project, maintaining and funding 11 reading rooms themselves, has influenced the expansion of the program which now encompasses over 270 rooms in 23 states and Washington DC, impacting more than 125,000 students.


A MESSAGE FROM KATIE


I am grateful for the opportunity to return to the Carson Scholars Fund (CSF) as the Executive Director.


